## PSALM 78:4

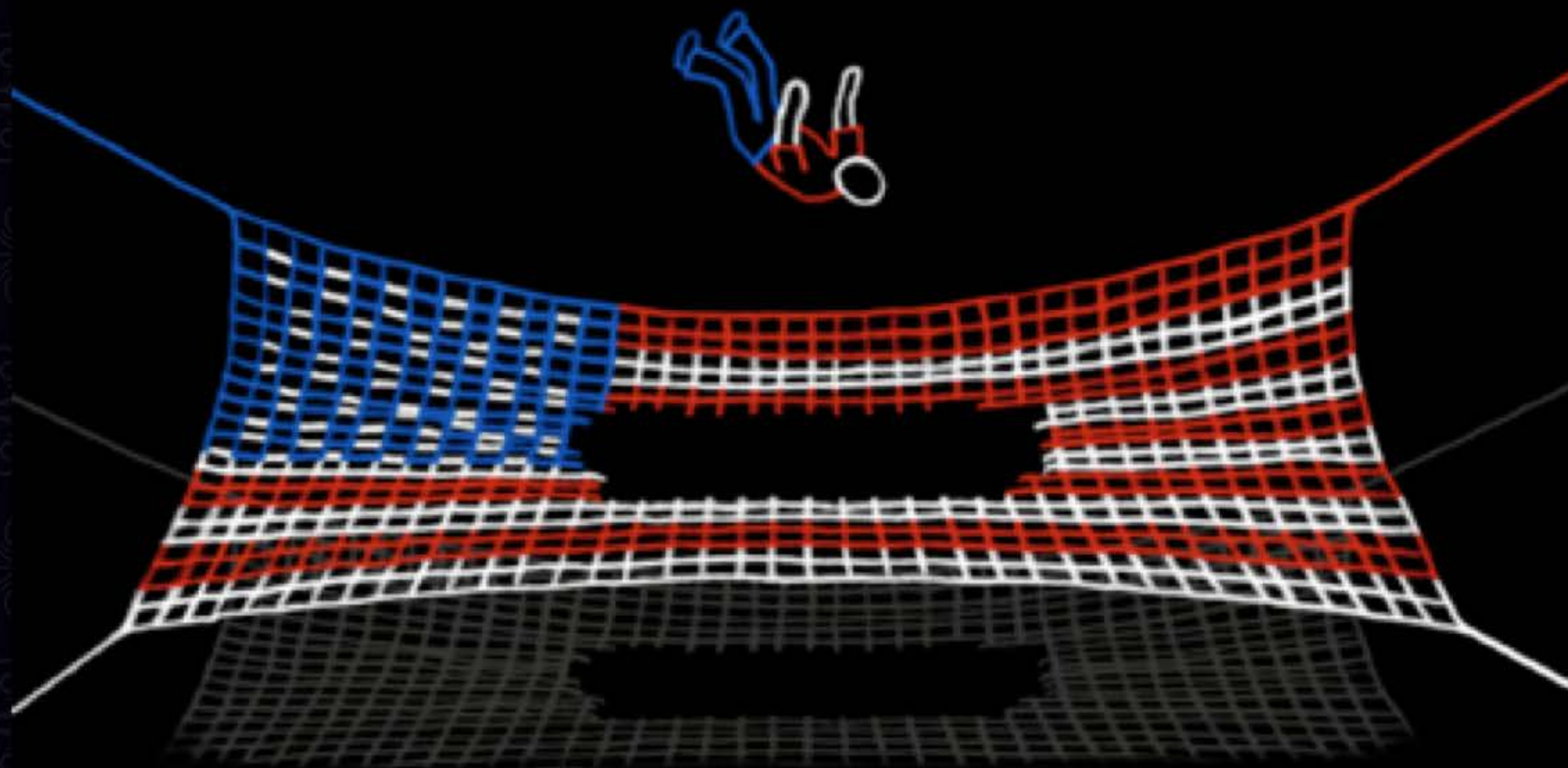
**We will not hide them from their descendants;

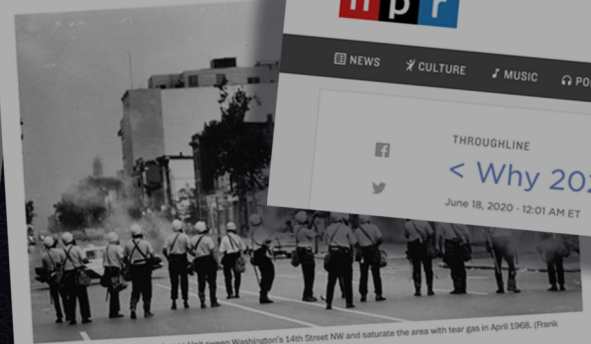
