The 10/40 Window

The 10/40 window is the rectangular area of North Africa, the Middle East and Asia approximately between 10 north and 40 degrees north latitude.



Why the 10/40 Window?

1. The historical and biblical significance
2. The least evangelized countries
3. The prevalence of the poor
4. The least evangelized mega-cities



Why campuses?

First, most missionaries continue to go to mostly Christian nations.

The most Christianized nations receive more than 34% of all international missionaries. Many 10/40 Window countries restrict or deny missionary access; they receive only 9% of all international missionaries.



Why campuses?

Second, many 10/40 Window countries are closing to Western missionaries.

- Of the 10 countries in the world that are classified as hardest for US citizens to receive visas, seven of those are located in that area.



Why campuses?

Second, many 10/40 Window countries are closing to Western missionaries.

- Women account for a disproportionately large percentage of US missionaries, with single women outnumbering single men 4 to 1 on the mission field. But many of the cultures within the 10/40 Window are hostile to women.



Why campuses?

Third, the Global South is a sending zone.

After decades of taking the lead, the Western church may need to take a more supportive role in mission-critical zones.
